

## **Travel to and from the Airport:**

To make your journey to and from the airport easy, we recommend using the Airport Express Train (Flytoget). This train can be taken directly from the Nationaltheateret station to Oslo Airport Gardermoen. It is the fastest, easiest, and cheapest option available. Alternatively, you can also choose to take regular trains, buses, or taxis from the airport to Oslo.

### **Travel in Oslo:**

The event will be held in the city center, and all the locations are within walking distance. If you plan to explore other parts of Oslo, you can easily take the metro or buses. Ruter operates a ticket system for all public transport in Oslo. You can download the Ruter app or purchase tickets from kiosks or stations. Google Maps is a reliable tool for finding the best collective transportation route from one destination to another.
